### Asbestos Finding and Disposal.

Proper disposal: You cannot just dump asbestos in your home garbage pickup. You will need to dispose of the contaminated materials at an approved facility. The bar is typically set very low, requiring materials with as little as one percent asbestos to go in an approved waste area.

### Common Materials That Contain Asbestos

The best thing to do with asbestos is to leave it alone. Undisturbed asbestos-containing materials generally do not present a health hazard, provided the materials are in good condition and are not crumbling, flaking, or otherwise deteriorating. You might find these asbestos-containing materials in:

- Loose-fill insulation containing vermiculite
- Popcorn ceiling texture
- Textured paint and wall patching compound
- House siding
- Pipe insulation, particularly wraps or tape on older pipes
- Door gaskets on oil and coal furnaces
- Heat-resistant board and paper materials around wood stoves
- Vinyl floor tiles, tile backing, and tile adhesive
